Abstract

This study aimed to determine the English Proficiency among the second year BSCA students of the College of Business at JBLFMU (Molo), Inc. during the second semester of the Academic Year 2010-2011. The participants of this study were the 40 Second year BSCA students. Data were obtained through the use of adopted questionnaire from the Cambridge IELTS 3 Reviewer (Cambridge University 2002). Descriptive statistics employed were the means and standard deviation; and inferential statistics employed were the t-test for independent samples, the one-way ANOVA and Post Hoc Scheffe Test. The findings revealed that the English Proficiency Level in terms of grammar and comprehension among Second year BSCA students was "average". The students differed significantly in their English language proficiency when grouped according to English 1 Academic Performance--in favor of those who have high and excellent academic performance.
