## Abstract

This descriptive study aimed to determine the level of work stress among business department faculty members at JBLCF (Molo), Inc. during first semester 2005-2006. The participants were the 34 randomly selected customs business department faculty members. Data of this study were obtained using the adopted instrument on "Identify Sources of Work Stress" (Powell, 2000). Descriptive statistics employed were means and standard deviations. Results revealed that generally, the faculty members of the business department had "high" level of work stress in terms of work load, role, responsibility, relationship, job satisfaction and home work interface. When classified according to classification, age, year of

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teaching experience, and gender, the faculty members manifested "high" level of stress in terms of work load, role, responsibility, relationship, job satisfaction, and home work interface.
