THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN FAMILY CONDITIONS AND STUDY HABITS  
OF IRREGULAR CSM STUDENTS AT JBLCF-MOLO

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Abstract

This investigation was undertaken to determine the relationship between the family condition and study habits of 110 irregular third-year Cruise Ship Management students. The study focused on the correlation between two variables. The result of the study showed that the level of study habits among irregular CSM students is "Satisfactory" (M=3.72; SD=.54). The family conditions of the BSCSM irregular students in general were found to be "Satisfactory" (M=3.66; SD=.50), and even when classified according to family relationship (M=3.83; SD=.75), and family way of living (M=3.76; SD=.50). Family pressure was found to be "high" (M=3.39; SD=.76). It was found out that there was a moderately positive and significant relationship between the study habits of BSCSM irregular student and their family condition in general ( $r=.521$ ,  $p<.05$ ). Family relationship, family way of living and

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family pressure were significantly associated with the  
BSCSM irregular students' study habits.
